





HIGHLIGHTS


- New Mexico (NM) uses HPP funding to build and maintain a strong emergency preparedness and response foundation for the state's 2.1 million residents.
- NM's four health care coalitions (HCCs) established an HCC Regional Preparedness Coordinator to manage operations and resource sharing.
- NM Department of Health (DOH) increased situational awareness through a third-party information sharing platform used by all HCCs.

SPOTLIGHT ON PREPAREDNESS

The number of Medical Reserve Corps volunteers registered in the New Mexico Emergency System for Advance Registration of Volunteer Health Professionals system has more than tripled over the last 18 months. Community organizations, shelters, Emergency Support Function #6, and other organizations were invited to utilize the NMDOH-run volunteer registry to provide free background checks and position all volunteers to be eligible for Tort protections for their volunteer service.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- NMDOH utilizes the services of a third-party contractor to automate the reporting of required Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services data into its resource management and tracking tools, which eliminated the need to assign hospital staff to daily data reporting and reduces the risk of reporting errors.
- NM's HPP coordinated with the NM Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management to provide training to all non-profit hospitals regarding how to access and apply for FEMA Public Assistance for reimbursement of eligible COVID-19 expenses.
